The greatest part of this Continent, to which the Romans gave the Name TARRACONENSIS, is marked on the Border with Saffron Colour; BETHICA with Red, and LUSITANIA with Green: By this means the General Names have been omitted, that they might not hurt any Particulars in the Plan of the Map. There are some Places mentioned in ancient Historians, of which it is difficult to find the Situation, and which have escaped the Enquiries of the Learned of Spain themselves. No difficulty has been made to admit in this Map, in order to its being more usefull and compleat, a great number of Places which are posterior to the Times of the Romans.

By many Astron. Observations of J. Fathers Carbone, Collis Pr. and Capasso, related in J. Mem. of J. R. Acad. for the Year 1724, the difference of Longit. between Paris & Lisbon is 11^o 27', which agrees with J. corrected Graduation of this Map, tho' J. Position of Lisbon is farther back towards J. West than in J. Maps of M. Delisle.
