The Harbour of Port Mahon

Gibraltar was taken by the Confederate Fleet on July 1704 chiefly thro' the Courage & Bravery of the English Sailors who surpris'd the garrison into a sudden Surrender. It was now render'd invulnerable by the Erecting of new Batteries & many additional Works, so that there scarce a possibility of its being taken unless by Treachery or Surprise. The last mention'd method had probably succeeded in 1757 if it had not been timely discover'd; for 500 desperate Landers got into St. Michaels Cave with the greatest Difficulty by Chazars & others who have fallen on the back of the Town, which the Besiegers made general Assault on the front, but being discover'd before their design was ripe for Execution they were attacked by a detachment of 500 Garrison & oblig'd to take quarters in the Hospital where the vessel arriv'd on the 22^d of August. One Commander leading the way, & peris'd, not one out of 500 escap'd.

The Town of Mahon lies at the South East end of the Island of Minorca, in Lat. 39.54 and Longitude 5.2 E. N. E. from Gibraltar. The Island was taken from the Spaniards in Sept. 1708 by Major Gen. Stanhope. It is 38 miles long and 15 broad. Ciudadella is the Chief City, but the place of greatest strength is St. Philips Castle, a square Fort of 4 Bastions. The Harbour is one of the safest and most Commodious in the Mediterranean, and will contain a great Number of Ships being 4 miles in length & above half a mile in breadth.
