

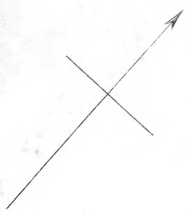

- G The Light Bodies of Cavalry advancing to support the 48<sup>th</sup>



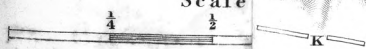

 On the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> of May, 1811.



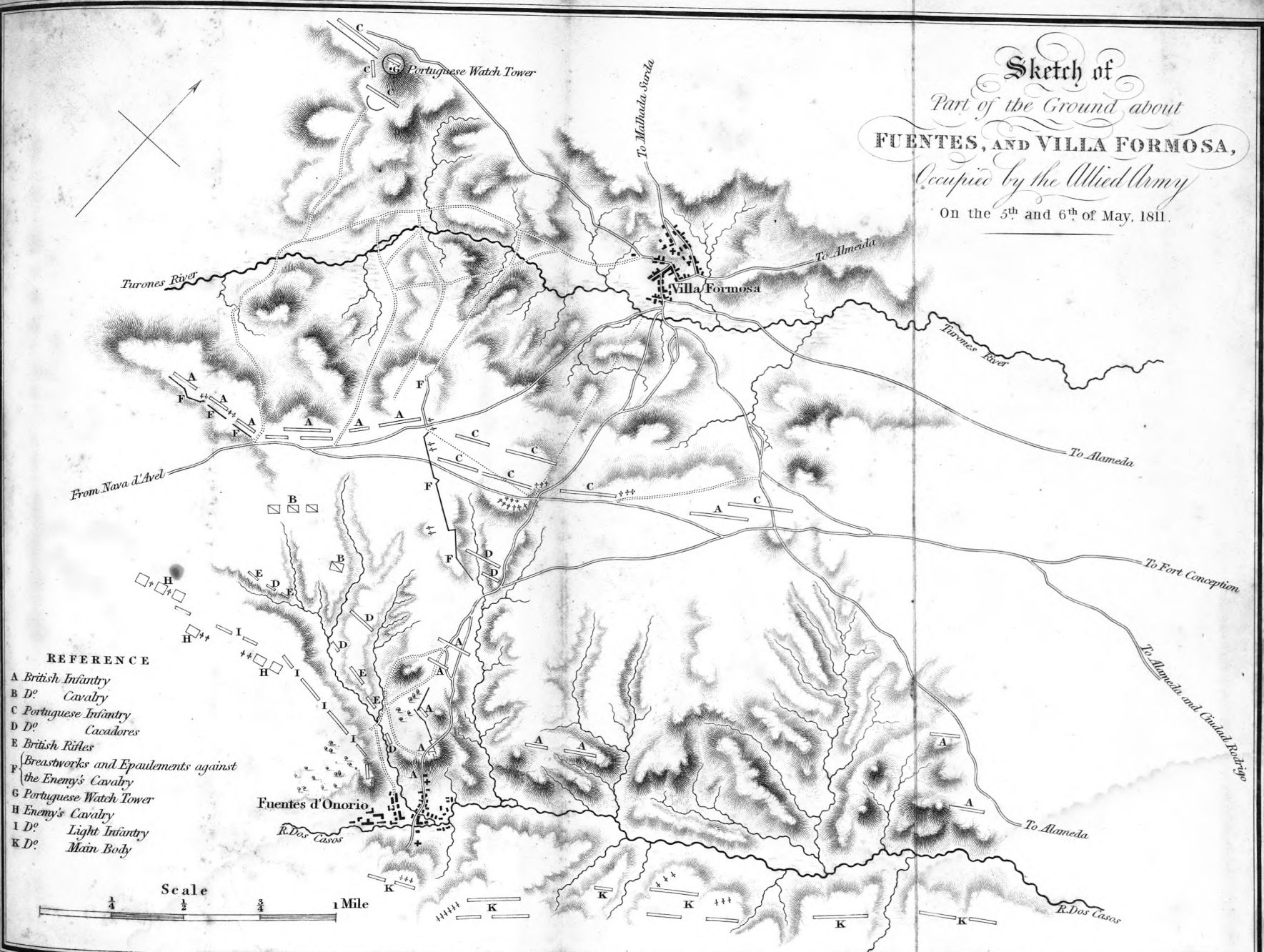

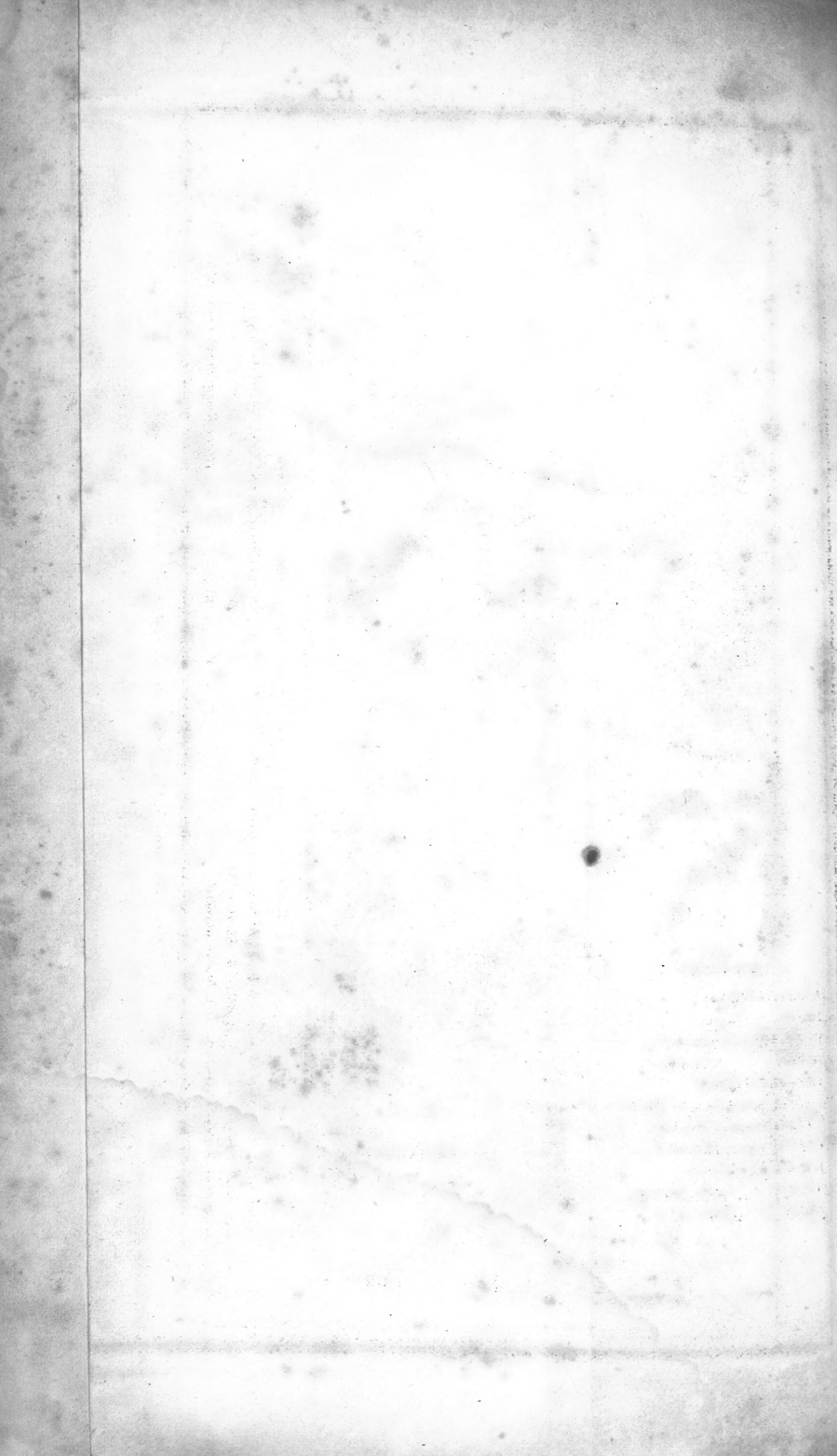

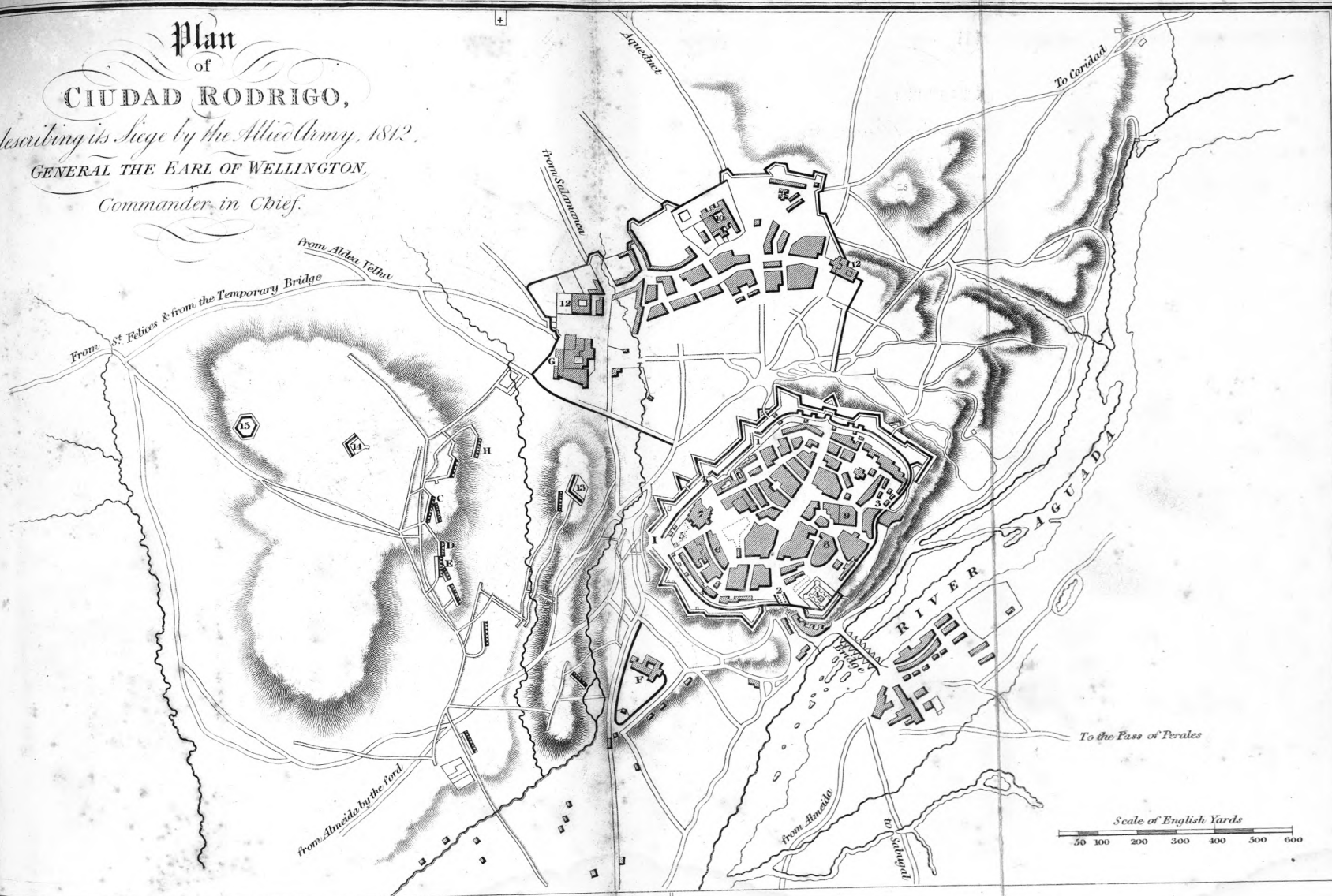

**REMARKS, 1812.**

- January 7<sup>th</sup> Lord Wellington Reconnoitred Ciudad de Rodrigo  
 8<sup>th</sup> The Place Invested, & at night the Redoubt Renoud (A) carried by Storm & a lodgement made in it.  
 9<sup>th</sup> at night The Batteries (C, D, E) to contain 33 Guns and the first parallel commenced.  
 13<sup>th</sup> at night The Convent of S. Cruz (F) carried by Storm & a lodgement made in it.  
 The second parallel commenced by the sap valante.  
 14<sup>th</sup> day The enemy made a sortie & destroyed part of the works. last night at 4 P.M. the batteries opened,  
 at night The Convent of S. Francisco (G) and the Suburbs carried by Storm.  
 15<sup>th</sup> at night The advanced battery on the left (H) for seven Guns begun.  
 18<sup>th</sup> at day light The battery for seven guns on the left opened.  
 19<sup>th</sup> night At ten minutes past seven the breaches (I, K) carried by Assault.

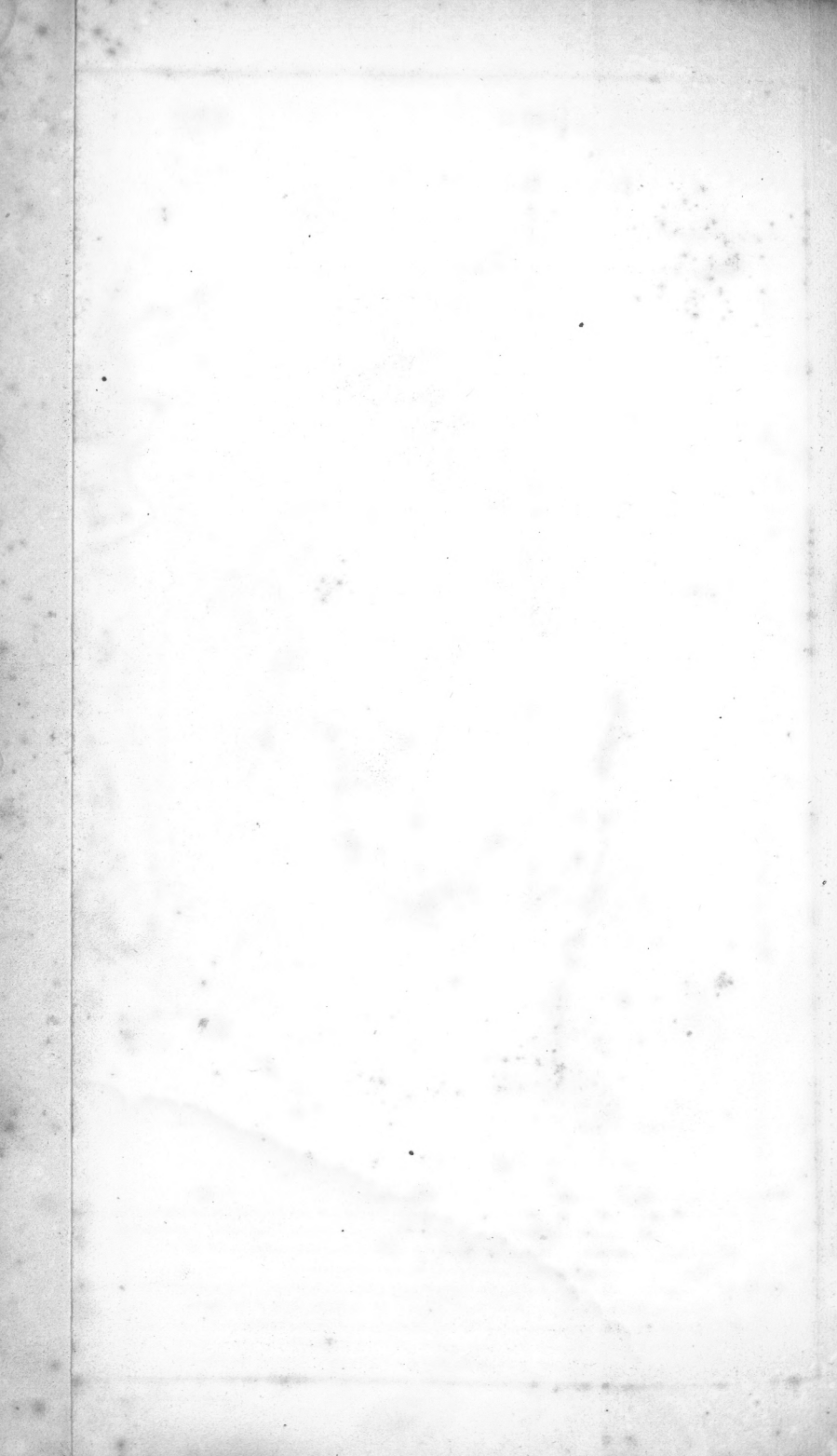

**NOTE.**

In the three batteries originally intended for the guns, only 25 24 pounders were mounted, and the seven guns for the advanced battery were supplied from these 25. The Works of the English for the reduction of the place are washed red. Those which the French used for the same purpose are washed yellow. They broke ground on the 15<sup>th</sup> June and the Spanish Garrison capitulated on the 12<sup>th</sup> July 1810.
